I'm concerned about the Carbon Impact of Stablepoint hosting.

Despite the <u>green hosting</u> credentials you set out on your website, when I tested my domain using the Green Web Foundation's tool, it returned <u>these 'Grey' results</u>.

In order to return 'Green' results, Stablepoint is required to submit accurate data on the energy supply of your servers to the Green Web Foundation database.

I would appreciate it if this message could be forwarded to Stablepoint management so that this can be looked into as a matter of urgency.

If Stablepoint it not able to return a 'Green' result from the Green Web Foundation, I plan to switch to a guaranteed 100% renewable green host when my current plan expires on 4 January 2024.

Message: Hi Ellie, I'm going to investigate and ask for clarity on the power mix that our upstream provider Leaseweb use in their UK datacentre, which is where your site is presently hosted. Leaseweb is one of our newer server partners so their details aren't yet on our about page. I do know their UK datacentres have ISO 50001 compliance, which relates to energy efficiency, but I don't know offhand the specific mix of energy their purchase from the grid, for example whether they purchase from exclusively renewable sources but I will find out for you.

I know it's not the same, but, irrespective of whether a supplier purchases from renewable sources or not, as an "extra" we do offset CO2 ourselves based on the approximate energy usage of each server using the average of the CO2 output of the UK National Grid supply which works out to 283 grams of CO2 for each KWH.

I will also talk to Leaseweb to see if they can submit their data to The Green Web Foundation's database so the information is updated correctly.

I've spoken to Leaseweb about their space in their UK datacentres, and the datacentre where your site is hosted is owned/managed by a company called Iron Mountain. They say that their global power footprint is entirely renewable:-https://www.ironmountain.com/data-centers/sustainability

"100% RENEWABLE DATA CENTERS

We have covered 100% of our global data center electricity consumption with renewable energy purchases each year since 2017.

In 2021 we set an ambitious goal to meet each hour of our energy use every day with local carbon free energy by 2040. In support of this goal we were founding signatories to the <u>UN 24/7 Carbon Free Energy Compact</u> and were the first colocation provider to join <u>The Climate Pledge</u>."

I still need to find out how/if we can ask them to fill out the required forms so that your site appears 'green' on the green webfoundation's site.
